

Gillan Class



Gillan Class have had a fun-filled and busy term packed with learning and creativity! In Maths, we focused on place value and shape, while in English, Year 1 and 2 re-wrote the story of *Jack and the Beanstalk*, concentrating on using subjects and verbs. Our EYFS children enjoyed countless stories in Drawing Club, with favourites including *Stick Man* and *The Gingerbread Man*. In Science, we explored animals including humans—learning about diets, senses, body parts, and classification. The younger children built habitats and discussed similarities and differences, while we all learned about healthy eating with a special visitor who helped us ‘taste the rainbow’ of delicious foods. EYFS even created a picnic in their role-play kitchen!

In RE, we celebrated the meaning of Christmas and acted out the Nativity story, understanding why it is important to Christians. PE has been all about gymnastics—jumping, balancing, and stretching to build strength and confidence. In DT, we designed and made interactive pages for a collaborative book using levers and sliders to make parts move—what super engineers we are!

This month brought festive excitement with Christmas activities and the conclusion of our History topic on ‘Toys,’ showcased in a fantastic classroom display featuring toys from different generations. In Computing, we continued learning about online safety, making smart choices online. PSHE focused on ‘Valuing Differences,’ encouraging thoughtful discussions and building respect and empathy within our classroom community.



St Anthony Class







This year we have:


- Supported **479 young carers in getting a break** from their caring role

IMPORTANT CHANGES TO THE LAW REGARDING PENALTY NOTICES FOR UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

As of 19th August 2024, the government's new National Framework for Penalty Notices for School Absence (including unauthorised holidays) comes into effect.

This affects when penalty notices are issued in Cornwall

There is a new national threshold of 10 unauthorised sessions for any reason (equivalent to 5 school days) within a rolling 10 school week period

A parent will no longer be able to take their child out of school for one week's holiday without a potential penalty notice being issued.

There is an increase in the penalty fine from £60 to £80 if paid in 21 days. If the fine is not paid by the first 21 days, it will rise to £160, if paid within 28 days of being issued.

If a second penalty fine is issued to the same parent for the same child within a 3-year rolling period, the fine will automatically rise to £160 with no option to pay the lower rate of £80.

If a parent commits a third offence in a 3-year rolling period, the local authority will consider other enforcement options available. This may include prosecution for the offence of failing to ensure your child's regular attendance.

Reporting Absences

If your child is going to be absent from school due to illness, please inform the office by 9am in the morning. Please let us know why your child is going to be absent and when you expect them to return. You may either phone the office on 01326231431 and leave a message.

Attendance Guidance

Here at Manaccan Primary School, we recognise that there are occasions when it is appropriate to authorise an absence, such as when a pupil is genuinely too ill to attend school, has a medical appointment that cannot be taken out of school hours or a request for leave has been agreed in exceptional circumstances. However, the Government does not support parents taking children out of school unless the school agrees this is appropriate under 'exceptional circumstances'. Any request for leave should be made in writing to the Head of School using the school's request form. Please note - at Manaccan Primary School we are not able to authorise holidays as this is not deemed to be an 'exceptional circumstance'.

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid after this but within 28 days. If your child is further absent from school without authorisation within any 3-year period, you will be committing a further offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices for a second offence are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £160, payable within 28 days. Importantly, fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action such as a parenting order or prosecution will be considered. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may also result in legal action. If you are prosecuted and attend court because your child has not been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs. Absence not authorised by the school may also result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Again, Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs. Money raised from fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. Any extra money is returned to the government.



Following parent/carer feedback, we will be trialling a Breakfast Club during the Spring Term, starting on **Monday 12th January 2026**. This will allow time for bookings to be made during the first week back. Please find the details below:

Days and Times: Monday to Friday, 7:35am – 8:35am

Location: Entrance via the playground gate and into the hall through the hall door

Cost: £5.50 per hour session (includes a light breakfast snack such as toast or cereal)

Booking:

- All bookings will be made via ParentPay.
- Booking payment items will be added to your ParentPay account for advance payment please.
- If you experience any issues with your ParentPay account, please contact the school office where Mrs Howard and Mrs Thomas will be happy to support you.
- Bookings for the following week must be made by Wednesdays at 3:00pm.
- Unless there is an unavoidable emergency, no bookings will be accepted after this deadline.
- For the first week of Breakfast Club (week beginning 12th January 2026), bookings must be made by 3:00pm on Wednesday 7th January.
